In 1961, he started practicing in Delhi, at the Supreme Court, in the chambers of Mr. M.C. Setalvad, the First Attorney General of India. Desai (Judge, Supreme Court of India) and others eminent lawyers of India appreciated the work done by Late Sh. O.P. Malhotra, Senior Advocate.

Late Sh. O.P. Malhotra was designated as a Senior Advocate by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India as well as Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in 1969 and he was also a Senior Central Government Council.

During his lifetime, he wrote "The Law of Industrial Disputes, which is currently running in its sixth edition.

In 2002, the first edition "The Law and Practice of Arbitration and Conciliation, a commentary on the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 was published.

He was also appointed as an arbitrator in various disputes.

He is survived by three daughters (out of whom 2 are Advocates) and One son, who is also an Advocate. Four of his grandchildren are also advocates.

The whole legal fraternity will miss this eminent lawyer, but will ever remain thankful to the immense contributions made by him to the legal fraternity.
